HEALTHY SMILES

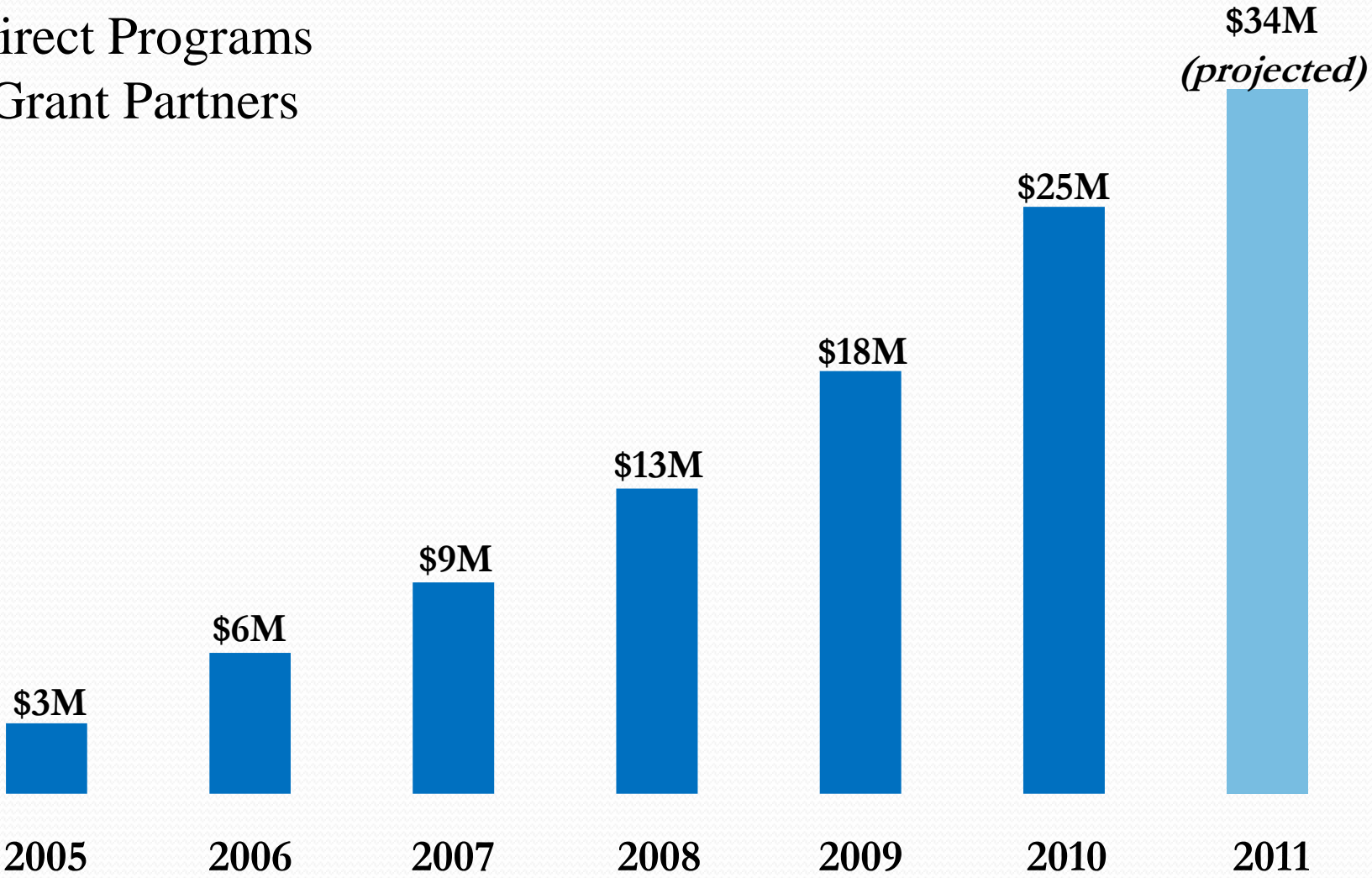
Offering free dental services to children at Title I schools in six school districts and families at safety net clinics.

Direct Financial Impact

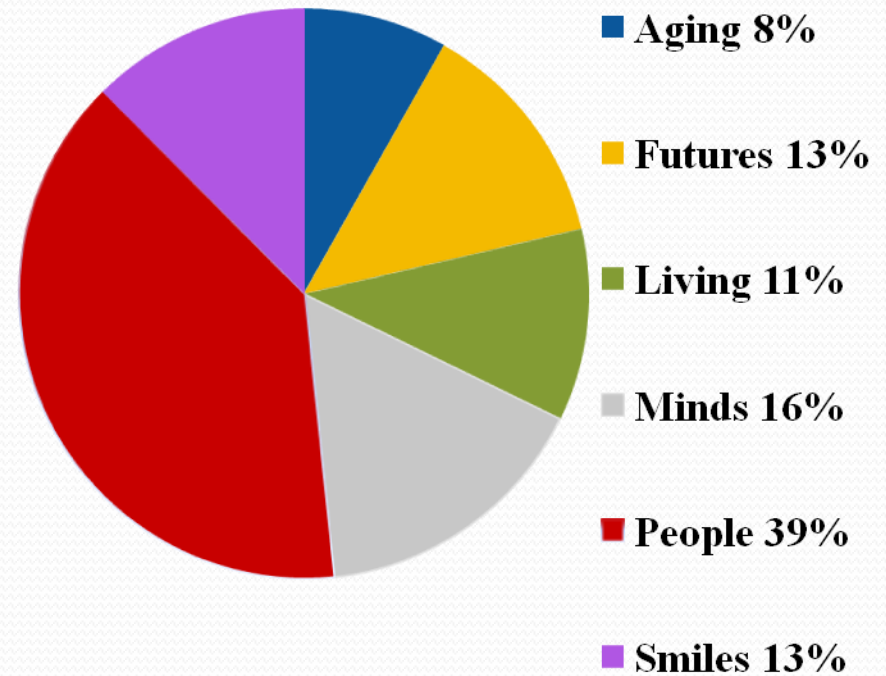

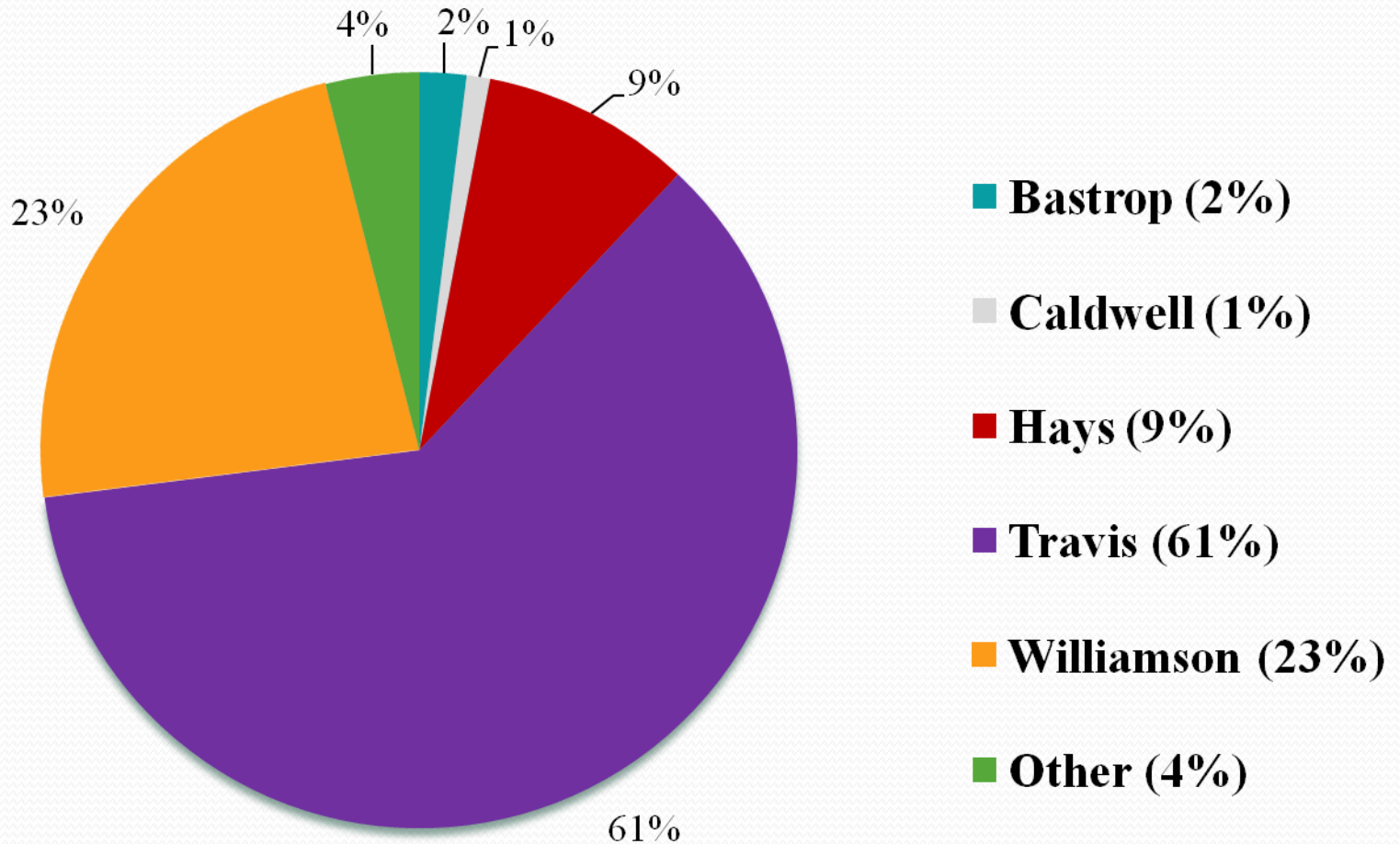
