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Outcomes & Indicators

The Child and Youth Mental Health Planning Partnership has created three subcommittees to study and form recommendations for the following three (3) community outcomes and indicators.

Outcomes & Indicators, cont.

Priority Outcome: Children and youth demonstrate empathy and other pro-social behaviors in diverse relationships.

Indicator: The number and rate of disciplinary removals.

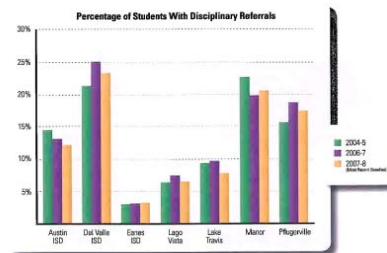
Priority Outcome: Children and youth demonstrate empathy and other pro-social behaviors in diverse relationships.

Disciplinary Referrals

Indicator: The number and rate of disciplinary referrals

Definition: The percentage of students whose behavior shows disrespect for others, including interference with their access to education and/or a safe environment resulting in disciplinary action.

Significance: Disciplinary referrals reflect a school environment that can not foster academic success or a sense of community. Students who do not feel safe at school are more likely to dropout and/or be involved in criminal activity.

Priority Outcome: Children and youth have good mental health and are emotionally resilient.

Indicator: The rates of children who report to be sad, unhappy, depressed or stressed.

Indicator: The teen suicide rate.

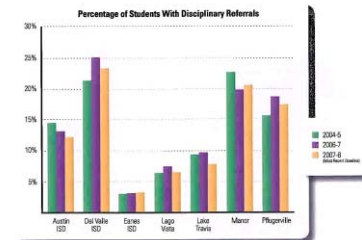
