Criminal Justice Indicator

- % of individuals with serious mental illness in Travis County Jail
- Bazelon Performance Improvement Project
- Root Cause Analysis



CJ Indicator— Preliminary Findings

- 30 cases analyzed thus far
- Frequent 911 and Community Competency Restoration
- White males overrepresented
- Schizophrenia/Schizoaffective most common diagnoses
- 80% with co-occurring substance use



CJ Indicator— Preliminary Findings

- Housing instability for virtually all
- Alternatives to 911
- Peer Support for frequent callers
- Transportation Issues



Readmission Indicator

- Readmission to psychiatric hospitals within 30 days of discharge
- Publicly funded slots at Austin Lakes, Seton Shoal Creek and ASH
- Crisis Implementation Committee is Steering Committee



Readmission Indicator

- Study Period: 9/1/2009-5/1/2010
- 236 Readmissions in this time frame
- 137 Unique Individuals
- 104 Records Reviewed (76%)
- 38 Individuals Re-Admitted more than 1 time (100% reviewed)



Multiple Readmissions

- 60% housing instability
- 24% criminal justice
- 16% current ACT Clients
- 34% were “lost to follow up”



Multiple Readmissions— “Lost to Follow Up”

- 85% Male
- 70% Substance Use
- 77% Refusing Follow Up Care
- 69% Homeless/Housing Instability
- 31% Unable to Locate
- Transportation Issues
- Many: All of the Above



Schools Youth Indicator

- # of discretionary removals from AISD Schools
- Child/Youth Mental Health Planning Partnership is Steering Committee



Substance Use Indicator

- % of ED admissions with primary substance use diagnosis
- Adult Behavioral Health Planning Partnership considering serving as Steering Committee



Housing Indicator

- % of individuals presenting to various settings for behavioral health services reporting moderate to significant housing instability
- Texas Recommended Assessment Guidelines
